ZooKeys is a peer-reviewed, open-access, rapidly disseminated journal launched to accelerate research and free information exchange in taxonomy, phylogeny, biogeography and evolution of animals.

ZooKeys aims to apply the latest trends and methodologies in publishing and preservation of digital materials to meet the highest possible standards of the cybertaxonomy era.

ZooKeys publishes papers in systematic zoology containing taxonomic/faunistic data on any taxon of any geological age from any part of the world with no limit to manuscript size.

ZooKeys considers for publishing works on the following topics:

- ◆ new descriptions of taxa, if they are accomplished with proper diagnoses, keys and/or revision of at least at species group level

- ◆ taxonomic revisions of extant (or “recent”) and fossil animal groups

- ◆ checklists and catalogues
- ◆ phylogenetic and evolutionary analyses
- ◆ papers in descriptive and/or historical biogeography
- ◆ methodology papers
- ◆ data mining and literature surveys
- ◆ monographs, conspecti, atlases
- ◆ collections of papers, Festschrift volumes, conference proceedings

ZooKeys accepts papers containing identification keys with priority. Extensive manuscripts consisting mostly of keys will be considered for publishing as well. ISBN numbers will be assigned to large monographic papers (i.e., major revisions of taxa), monographs, collections of papers, Festschrift volumes, atlases, checklists, conspecti.

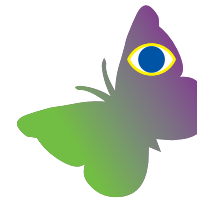
